



Skirmishes along the Chur, February 6. 1499

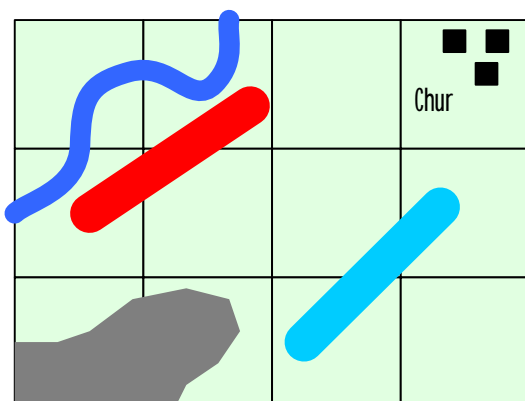
Heeding a call for help after the incursion of Tyrolian troops in January 1499 (Tyrol being a Habsburg dominion), 200 Urians come to the assistance of Münstertal. After the arrival of the Urian force the Tyrolians agreed to a peaceful withdrawal of their troops.

While marching homewards along the banks of the Rhine the Urians run into a force of Imperial Landsknechte on the other side of the river. The Landsknechte starts to jeer the Swiss whose temper explodes. The Urians charge across the shallow river and cuts down the Landsknechte. Afterwards a number of houses are looted and burned.

Hauptman Heini Wollebs angry swiss command are indicated on the map using the red color. The surprised Landsknechte are indicated by the blue line.

The dark area in the lower left hand of the map is a forest and should be treated as ROUGH GOING.

The river is fordable along its entire course but is considered DIFFICULT GOING.
